**The triangular slave trade was a very profitable system of enslavement, designed to provide labour for plantations in the Americas. It involved three journeys:**

**1. West Indies:** Guns, cloth, rum, beer

**2. Africa:** Slaves, sugar, molasses

**3. North/South America:** Sugar, molasses, wood

**4. West Indies:** Slaves, sugar, molasses

**5. Africa:** Whole of, hatter, fern, rice, silk, indigo, tobacco

**Significant individual:** Mary Beaulieu (1805-1881) was a nurse in the 1850s who set up the 'Black Home' in the Congo, where she cared for soldiers injured in the Congo war.

**WORLD WAR II TIMELINE**

- 1939: 1st September: Germany invades Poland
- 1940: 1st September: France and Denmark are overrun
- 1941: 1st September: Battle of Britain begins
- 1942: 1st September: Pearl Harbor and USA enters the war
- 1943: 1st September: The Allies take the battle of Stalingrad
- 1944: 1st September: D-Day
- 1945: 1st September: Germany surrenders
